We are so proud of these students and look forward to seeing which students qualify next half term!


















Student Council



Sparx Reader is an online reading platform allowing students to regularly read books for pleasure. Everyday reading is not only a relaxing activity, but also allows students to expand their ideas, vocabulary and improve understanding of any text they will face in exams or as adults.

Sparx Reader offers students a choice of books at their reading level, as well as ensuring they read books with understanding by completing check-in questions along the way. The platform is used for KS3 English weekly homework; students need to achieve minimum 300 points each week (this equates to approximately 30 min of careful reading).

We are very pleased that many of our students exceed this target every week, with some top scorers achieving well above a thousand points a week. Since the launch of Sparx Reader a month ago, our KS3 students have completed amazing 2902 hours of careful reading and read altogether 1067 books so far. Truly well done!

A&Es across Barnet and our neighbouring boroughs are under significant pressure, with a high number of flu cases, particularly among characters young people. Please follow this advice to all parents and carers on keeping yourself and your children well.

- Flu cases are currently very high in Barnet. If you think you or your child may have flu, find out what steps to take: <u>flu symptoms in children</u> and young people and <u>flu advice for adults</u>
- It's not too late to get vaccinated. If you are <u>eligible for a flu jab</u>, contact your GP or <u>book an appointment at your local community pharmacy</u>. Has your child missed their flu vaccination at school? <u>Find catch-up clinics in Barnet</u>.

- NHS urgent treatment centres or walk-in centres can help with urgent, but non-life threatening, injuries or illnesses.

Barnet's Free Home Energy Fix - Apply Today

With rising energy prices, many Barnet households are feeling the pressure, with 10% estimated to be facing fuel poverty. Help is available. Barnet Council has partnered with Groundwork London's Green Doctors Service, to provide free home energy support to residents, to cut energy bills and stay warm this winter.

By making a referral to the Green Doctor scheme, you'll receive:

- A free home energy visit: Tailored in-person or over the phone advice, based on your specific needs.
- Energy-saving kit: Items like LED bulbs and draught-proofing materials to keep your home warm.
- Guidance on energy efficiency: Tips on reducing energy use, switching suppliers, and accessing grants.

This service is available to households that meet certain criteria, including those on low income, over 60s, families with young children, or pregnant, and individuals with ongoing medical conditions.

Plus, eligible residents who apply for the Green Doctor service by 28 February 2025 will have the chance to win one of four £100 B&M gift vouchers.

With 40% of the borough's carbon emissions linked to residential energy use - not only will you save money, but you'll also be contributing to Barnet's goal of becoming a net zero borough by 2042.
