Faith and Respect: Lessons from Paul of Tarsus

This month, our school is focusing on the value of respect—a fundamental principle that is deeply rooted in our faith and tradition. One powerful example of respect in action can be seen in the life of Paul of Tarsus, one of the most influential figures in early Christianity.

Originally known as Saul, Paul was once a fierce critic of Jesus' followers. However, after a profound spiritual experience on the road to Damascus, he became a devoted believer and one of the faith's greatest teachers. What's striking is how Paul showed respect to people from all backgrounds—Jew and Gentile alike. He travelled extensively, listened to others, and spoke to each community in a way they could understand. He taught that every person is made in the image of God and deserves dignity.

In his letters, Paul urged early Christians to "honour one another above yourselves" (Romans 12:10), a message that still speaks to us today. Respect means treating others kindly, even when we disagree. It means listening before judging and recognising the worth of every individual.

As we go about our week, may we all strive to follow Paul's example—living with humility, kindness and respect in everything we do.











Year 12 Trade Union Congress Trip



On 25 June, as part of the school's careers and further education programme, a number of Year 12 students took part in the Members Day 2025, organised by The European Atlantic Movement (TEAMGlobal) an 'independent, non-party political educational foundation' (from

The students initially visited the Trade Union Congress and the Supreme Court. Later in the day, they attended the Members' Day Afternoon Tea held in the Cholmondeley Room and Terrace of the House of Lords, during which they had the privilege of listening to an inspiring address delivered by The Baroness Benjamin of Beckenham OM DBE DI. The day concluded with a guided tour of the House of Commons and the students received the opportunity to observe part of a live parliamentary debate from the public gallery within the Chamber.

The trip on Wednesday was an eye-opening experience. At the Trade Union Congress, we had a tour of the historical building and learned about the role of unions in protecting the employees in their working field. At the Supreme Court, we were informed about the history of the highest court in the country and we took part in a mock trial. However, the afternoon tea in the Cholmondeley Room in the Palace of Westminster was the highlight of the day, as we enjoyed various delicacies and we listened to the speech of Baroness Benjamin, who inspired me with her stories during my childhood. Finally, we had a tour of the Parliament and sat in the public gallery, where we attended part of the debate in the House of Commons. This trip helped me to see the different career options available to me as an aspiring Politics student and created a renewed motivation towards my A Levels and my future career.

The first stop on our trip was the Trade Union Congress (TUC), where we were fortunate to be among the final visitors to tour this iconic post-war building. TUC's Congress House left a lasting impression, particularly the moving pietà-style sculpture in the courtyard by Jacob Epstein, depicting a grieving mother cradling her fallen son. Next, we visited the Supreme Court of the United Kingdom, where we received fascinating talks in each of the courtrooms, offering a glimpse into the workings of the nation's highest judicial authority. Later, we made our way to the Cholmondeley Room and Terrace in the House of Lords, within the Palace of Westminster. There, we had the privilege of hearing an inspiring speech by Baroness Floella Benjamin, who encouraged us all to believe in ourselves and persevere, regardless of the challenges encountered. We concluded our day with a tour of Parliament, where we observed a live debate in the House of Commons. The entire experience was not only informative but profoundly empowering and we are thankful for the opportunity to engage with the UK's political and legal heritage.




