Forgiveness: A Cornerstone of Our Faith

At the heart of our Greek Orthodox school lies the profound value of forgiveness. Rooted in Christ's love, forgiveness is not just an ideal but a daily practice that guides how our students, staff, and families build community.

We are especially inspired by the lives of *Saints Cosmas and Damian*, the holy "Unmercenaries" (Ἀνάργυροι)—twin brothers and physicians who healed without payment, freely offering their gifts in the name of Christ ("ull-of-grace-and-truth-blogspot.com", en. wikipedia.org). On their feast days (1 July and 1 November), we remember not only their generosity but also their commitment to mercy and self-sacrifice. These saints embodied forgiveness through compassionate service—they healed wounds of body and soul, extending God's grace to all who came to them .

Forgiveness also preserves harmony. A touching tale tells of Damian hesitating to accept a gift from Palladia—his brother Cosmas disapproved, but a divine miracle reunited them in eternal harmony (accepts). This story reminds us that forgiveness fosters unity, even when misunderstandings arise among brothers, classmates, or friends.

In our classrooms, we encourage students to follow this example—offering forgiveness after disagreements, loving one another in humility, and understanding that true forgiveness requires both grace and courage. Parents, we invite you to nurture this virtue at home by demonstrating forgiveness in everyday moments.

As we continue the academic year, let us hold forgiveness close in prayer and action. When we forgive, we become living icons of Christ's mercy. Inspired by Saints Cosmas and Damian, may our school be a place where forgiveness heals, restores, and builds a stronger, more loving community.








We are thrilled to announce that **Andreas**, a dedicated and passionate student of Classics, has been awarded the prestigious Jack Petchey Achievement Award in Classics. Andreas has shown exceptional enthusiasm and commitment to the study of Classics, and he has been eager to share his wider knowledge of ancient history and the classical myths with the rest of his peers, throughout the year. Ms Fitzgerald, the teacher that nominated Andreas, wrote, "He is a very kind and caring student and a great asset in any lesson as he is always prepared to share his ideas openly".

As part of celebrating excellence in Classics, we invited **Dr Daniel Sutton**, Research Fellow in Classics and History of the University of Cambridge, to deliver an insightful presentation on the Greek temples to a group of Year 9 students that enjoy the subject.

Dr Sutton sparked an enlightening discussion on the role of Greek temples within the context of the ancient world and drew particular emphasis on the Parthenon. The presentation encompassed its historical significance, religious function, and architectural features.

Following the presentation, the students were provided with curated resources and engaged in collaborative group work aimed at uncovering the secrets hidden in original classical sources.

At the end of the session, Dr Sutton presented Andreas with a signed, hardcover copy of *The Odyssey*. Additional copies of the renowned poem will be on display in the library of our new building in September, providing students with a unique opportunity to engage with the beauty of ancient Greek literature.
