












### **Celebrating 80 Years of the United Nations!**

# Year 12 Trip to Whipsnade Zoo

Year 12 A Level Biology students recently visited Whipsnade Zoo to enhance their understanding of animal behaviour and welfare. During their visit, students used ethograms to observe and record the behaviours of chimpanzees, applying key principles of behaviour studies in a real-world setting. We also studied the role of operant conditioning and intelligence in zoo management, learning how positive reinforcement helps animals cooperate with veterinary procedures. We then explored how enclosure design supports enrichment, encouraging natural behaviours that promote both physical and psychological well-being.


