In our community, names drawn from Greek and early Christian heritage reinforce our spiritual roots. Whether or not we have students or staff named Marina, the name evokes the sea's depth and steadfastness—and it suggests constancy, as does our calling to live faithfully.

That calling is reflected in our value of **Responsibility**. As we prepare to inhabit our new building, let us embrace our responsibility in tangible ways: keeping worship areas reverent, classrooms cared for, and every corner reflecting the dignity of our school. Responsibility also speaks to how we care for one another—through kindness, consideration, and service.

Let us pray that this fresh chapter in our new building will deepen our spiritual life, foster strong bonds, and encourage us to carry our faith into all our actions. Just as the sea (marina) is constant, may our commitment to faith and responsibility remain unwavering.


Guide our teachers, our students, and our community in fostering an environment of love, acceptance, and mutual respect founded on our understanding that we are all made in Your image.
