Thank you for your support in ensuring that your children are ready to attend online lessons on Microsoft Teams starting with form time at 8:30am every morning. Attendance has been very high and we are very pleased with the positive level of engagement from all of our students. Please do get in contact with your child's form tutor or their Head of Year if you are experiencing any difficulties and we would be pleased to assist you.

Please advise your children to make a note of their usernames and ask them to select a memorable password for all of our online learning platforms. We have been able to reset the user details for over 20 students but we do not wish any of our students to lose any valuable learning time so please check in with your children to ensure that they are logging in successfully every day.

We were delighted to meet with our Year 11 and Year 13 students and their families using our new Online Parent meeting system and initial feedback from students, families and staff has been very positive.

We have sent out a short questionnaire to Year 11 and Year 13 Parents and Carers and we would be pleased to receive your feedback so that we can continue to further improve our provision.

We are looking forward to celebrating name days in our Assemblies where we link the significance of the name day with the relevant Saint. On Thursday 14 January, we celebrated the name day of Nina (Nina, Ninas). Saint Nina is said to have belonged to a Greek-speaking Roman family from Kolastra, Cappadocia and

was a relative of Saint George. Saint Nina is believed to have performed miraculous healings and converted the Georgian Queen Nana, and eventually the pagan King Mirian III of Iberia, who, lost in darkness and blinded on a hunting trip, found his way only after he prayed to Saint Nina.

Year 11: *Christina A 11E* and *Thea P 11G* — the highest achievements points since the beginning of term and showing high levels of commitment and effort during remote learning.


Year 12: James H 120 and Roksolana W 12A - high levels of effort and commitment in lessons.
